STEWARDSHIP SUBCOMMITTEE (FINANCE)

Stewardship simply means taking care of something that belongs to another. Knowing that everything we own, and all we are or ever will become belongs to God, it is the responsibility of the Stewardship Committee to challenge the people of God with the privilege of responsible Christian stewardship of money, time and talents.

- Plan, promote, and oversee the annual stewardship campaign. This may include, but is not limited to:
- Recruit a committee for the annual stewardship campaign.
- Develop a campaign focus and promotional materials, such as, bulletin inserts, table tents, newsletter articles, etc.
- Host a stewardship luncheon or other promotional event.
- Arranging for Minutes for Stewardship during morning services.
- Provide an annual mailing of Pledge Cards, or Estimate of Giving, to church members.
- Track and report regularly on campaign results.
- Communicate clearly and regularly the financial needs of the Church.
- Develop a year-round stewardship program to encourage each member of the congregation to intentionally commit their time, talent and treasure
 - Create and facilitate programs for the congregation that will teach "stewardship" as a way of life for Christian discipleship
 - Communicate with the congregation about the importance of giving and the theological rationale for generosity
 - Remind the congregation that good stewardship is a constant process and not a one-time event.
