REFLECTIONS: PLEASE MR. POSTMAN

Please Mister Postman, look and see Is there a letter, a letter for me I've been standin' here waitin' Mister Postman So patiently, for just a card, or just a letter

I'm not sure if the young girl singing ever received a letter from her boyfriend "so far away". However, I am confident that the majority of us have neither received or for that matter written a personal letter recently. While you may have written a short note in some of your Christmas cards (if you even sent Christmas cards), I venture to say it probably was an exception to your normal practice. Today, so many of us largely rely on texting and social media platforms to communicate. Prolific letter writers like President George H.W. Bush have gone the way of the dinosaur age.

In an earlier age, the Bible reveals another prolific letter writer: the Apostle Paul. Of the 27 books in the New Testament, 21 are epistles or letters and most are attributed to Paul. Can you imagine Paul sending a text in lieu of writing the Book of Romans to explain that God's righteousness and saving justice is available to all people through faith? Although Paul was a serious theologian, he often included the personal touch of greeting his recipients with the goodwill salutation of "grace and peace" plus his letters would often commend fellow evangelists such as Timothy Phebe to the churches. Paul's deep affection for the Philippians is expressed in v.8 when he wrote "For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus" (NRSV).

In this era of digital messaging, we lose much of the personal touch that a handwritten letter that we've sealed in an envelope can offer. Consider taking a few moments out of your hectic schedule and just breathe and write. While it may take a little bit longer than electronic messaging, you will find that you can really focus on your thoughts and words when you're writing it down. I predict you and your recipient will find it surprisingly rewarding and ever so much more meaningful than a text. At least for me,

a personal letter received in the mail is much more exciting than a bill!

So, who should you write a letter to? Possible recipients could be your relatives, friends, your future self, or even God.

TRANSITIONAL WORSHIP




