REFLECTIONS: OSTRICHES AND NO SEE UMS

Ostriches and no see ums. You'd be forgiven if you thought that was an odd pairing. How can the flightless and largest bird on earth be compared to the pesky and miniscule insect that bite us during June and July? Yet, for this discussion, let's see if there's a connection albeit an obvious stretch on my part.

The ostriches' practice of covering their eggs in shallow sand and turning them from time to time with their beaks led early observers to believe they were hiding their eyes to so that they could avoid seeing problems around them. This mythical belief gave rise to the expression "burying your head in the sand". In other words, if you ignore or can't see a problem, it doesn't exist.

While the ostrich supposedly chooses not to see a problem, no see ums bring discomfort regardless of whether our eyes are open or not. No see ums are tiny gnats prevalent in Texas and the southern regions of our country. As the name implies. No se ums are largely unnoticed until you experience their itchy and painful bites that leave red dots and swelling on exposed areas of your body.

What's right in front of you that you don't, see? Often, we don't see what we find unpleasant or distressing: discrimination, poverty, spousal/child maltreatment, or someone experiencing various hardships. Perhaps we're in too much of a hurry and are preoccupied with our own "stuff". Maybe we feel too uncomfortable and look away. Or we turn a "blind eye" to someone else's troubles because we simply don't care enough (i.e. lack empathy) unless it directly affects us.

I wish to be more like a friend I once knew. Despite having life-ending lung cancer, she was always more concerned about what was going on in other people's lives. We'd be wise to realize that there's a lot going on around us when we really open our eyes and focus. Our world's a better and more caring place when our heads aren't buried in the sand, and we do see um.



The Generation-to-Generation (G2G) Committee is honored to share information about an important opportunity for you to leave a lasting legacy with St. Mark. Our special fund, *The Generation-to-Generation Fund, Leaving a Legacy* provides financially for the long-term future of St. Mark Presbyterian Church. On Pentecost Sunday, May 19, 2024 we will celebrate the birthday of the church and the Generation-to-Generation Fund.

In 1997 the Session created the *Bequest and Planned Giving Ministry* to receive personal gifts to the Church through planned giving and administered by the Session through the Finance Ministry. These gifts and donations are important to our church as they create a stable source of revenue for special projects and activities that exceed our annual budget. Your gifts directly support the mission and programs of the church.

In 2013 the Session renamed the fund *The Generation-to-Generation Fund* (G2G), a subcommittee of the Finance Ministry. The G2G Fund is currently valued at \$541,331 with \$100,000 as Restricted and the balance as Unrestricted. As good stewards of these gifts, the church has invested these funds with The Texas Presbyterian Foundation, a nonprofit, faith-based agency.

The Generation-to-Generation Fund multiplies the blessings of planned gifts and bequests by current generations to make a difference for future generations. Like the widow's might in the gospels there is no gift that is too small to make a difference for future generations.

The ushers will have the new *Generation-to-Generation Fund – Leaving a Legacy* Brochure for you on Pentecost Sunday. We invite you to meet with members of the G2G Committee after the Service in the Parlor to ask questions and learn more about this program.

Have you ever thought about joining the choir? This summer would be a great time to try us out! There are many reasons to join –


- Choir is an instant family full of wonderful people
